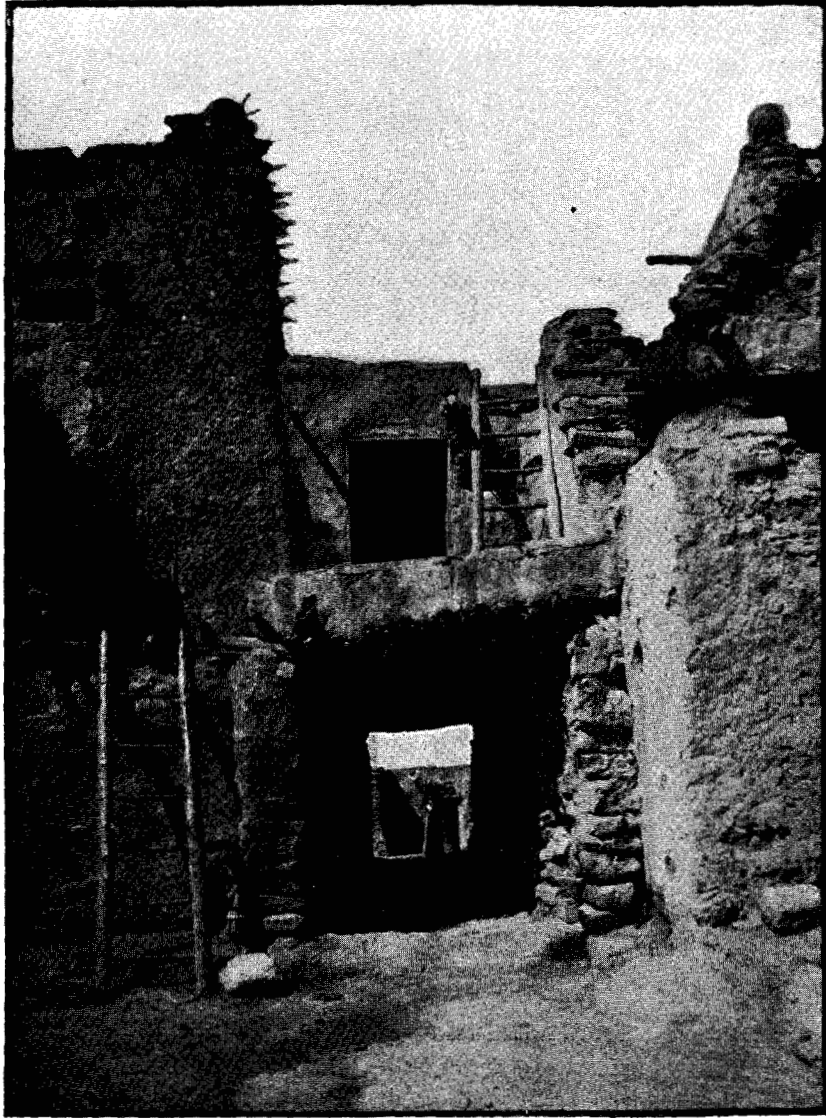


FIG. 71.—Vista in the Hopi pueblo of Walpi.
