But I never heard from him. Even a copy on paper could be satisfying as comparishing material, as I have a copy of the Lone dog wintercount on buffalo hide, drawn by an Indian.

Can I beg you to have the kindness to ask questions about Black Bull. This is a grandson of Sitting Bull. Black Bulls mother was a daughter of Sitting Bull. I knew Black Bull since 1930. He died August 5 1933, 72 years old at Porcupine. I am curious, what White Bull knows about him, because Indians don't like to speak of themselves, and so I don't know great things of the life of my friend Black Bull. I hope, that White Bull can tell something about him and I would be thankful if you have the kindness to write it to me.
