I have heard rumors that he was a graduate of West Point also but have not had time to make a check of the records.

You mention having recently seen Sitting Bull's autograph. Can you tell me where this autograph is? I would very much like to get a photograph of it for my book.

I had been hoping to see Mr. Thoburn of the Oklahoma State Historical Society to ask him whether or not his book of Western poems had come out, but he is now in the field excavating some old Indian mounds so I shall have to write him. If I can get a reply I shall let you hear how things are going.
