P.S. My two articles on Cody in Outdoor Life magazine "Buffalo Bill's Last Interview" and "Buffalo Bill's Grave"--which are really one article in two sections, several months apart for publication reasons--are now very hard to get. The magazine printed several thousand extra copies of each, but they soon vanished. The few left in the files the magazine sold for \$1 each, I understand, and I had but two left. A distant relative of Cody's in Canada wrote to me for one, and I could not aid him, so he wrote back and offered me \$5 for one of my copies, which I let him have. So if you run across any by accident some time I suggest you acquire them. Old copies are always showing up unexpectedly in odd places, even many years after publication, I have noticed, of all magazines. I once offered \$5 for a copy of McClure's magazine, Nov 1901, containing my "Snow Story," had N.Y.C.--Phila-Boston secondhand stores searched for a copy, and could not get it. Then 25 years later I ran across several copies here in Denver in a little secondhand place for 5¢ each, and of course raked them in immediately.

The enclosed pictures--in Sunday News-- from Cody's grave are not in the least exaggerated. Also see some of the fotos I ran in my two O'Life articles, if you can get copies. (I have but one each, cannot part with them.) C.T.
