One Bull's Memoirs.

After the Custer Fight the soldiers again fought us at Slim
Buttes where some women and children were killed. This fight was
brought on by a White man - known by the name of Yugal kiyotake Sitting with upraised hands. Sitting Bull had kept this man one
whole summer and one winter. He went back to his race in an
excellent health and in good spirit. He came back to Sitting
Bull's people - waging war against them.

Soon after we hunted buffaloes north of Missouri River - feeding our children. When Gen. Miles came upon us with his soldiers and again fought us. Bad Hair's son was killed: White Bull - my brother was shot in the arm. A mixed blood Sioux by the name of Eugene Bruquier was the interpreter for the general.

From there we went toward East and it was at this time that the Hunkpapayas started toward the Queens Land, but about half of them remained with S. B. round the Big Horn Mountains. Again we were off hunting for buffaloes when the soldiers, on foot, attacked and fired at us. No one was killed but the soldiers took ponies away from the Indians.

From there we went South into the head of Powder River country where we lived for a while. About this time S. B. wished to see his friend Crazy Horse but failed.

We moved Eastward from there when we discovered that the move to exterminate the buffalo was on - buffaloes were killed but only their hides were taken and the meat left with poison spread on them.
