I have heard that once the Dakotas captured all the horses of the Crow Indians. When was this? Who was the leader? Where did it happen? Was Sitting Bull there?

100 Sioux warriors went to the Crow country in Montana and captured over 500 horses. About 60 years ago. Sitting Bull was not there. Tree Top - a warrior who died about 15 years ago was the leader.

Soon after this the same warriors stole 250 head of horses from the Rees in northern part of this state.

I remember the five old men who told us about the killing of Sitting Bull's father, and some one (maybe in another tent) said that his own father had planned to rush in and save Sitting Bull's father, but did not get there in time. Can you get the whole story of this battle? Who was it that planned to save Sitting Bull's father? The boy did not make a note of that.

Sitting Bull's father (Jumping Buffalo) translated Tatanka-psica) was killed near the present city or town of McLaughlin, S. D. - about 150 Crows attacked 60 or 75 Sioux. Jumping Buffalo was rather old to have taken part. A young crow had a hand-to-hand fight with him and stabbed Jumping Buffalo - The young crow was killed in the battle. The Sioux have always regarded this combat of the Crow + Jumping Buffalo, as a cowardly affair. The Indian who rushed at them was many horses. He could not save Jumping Buffalo. In this fight Sitting Bull was wounded (ankle).
