No personal trouble with Sitting Bull or any of his men. Statement from Redtomahawk himself -- about 11 o'clock on the evening of December 14th, Bullhead asked Redtomahawk if he was fit for the task of getting Sitting Bull. Redtomahawk said "Yes," Redtomahawk gave you his story. By the way I have in my collection a rare photograph of Redtomahawk, White Bull (nephew of Sitting Bull) and myself.

I have heard that the summer before Sitting Bull died, McLaughlin called the police to his office and told them that it looked as if they would have to kill Sitting Bull. Did you ever hear about this? What was Sitting Bull doing that made McLaughlin say he wanted to kill him?

McLaughlin, John Grass, and Mad Bear were all jealous of Sitting Bull on account of the latter's great name and popularity. All three of these men had a meeting and they tried in every way to cause trouble with Sitting Bull. When Sitting Bull gave his ghost dance, this gave a good reason for the three above named men to cause his arrest and put him (Sitting Bull) out of the way. Another thing which might be of interest is that on the morning of December 15th the Policemen drank liquor near little Oak Creek (half way to Sitting Bull's camp) (This statement has been denied by Red tomahawk and others. I do not know how true is.)

Who were the leaders of the White Horse Riders when Sitting Bull organized it? Was Old Bull one? How many men belonged to that order at first? When was it founded? Who were its chiefs? I would like to know about this. 100 men belonged to the White Riders. Old Bull, One Bull, Circling Hawk were members. Sitting Bull was leader also Circling Hawk. It was founded over 100 years ago.

Another item of interest: In McLaughlin's book "My friend the Indian" he says that Crow foot made a few remarks which aroused the blood of Sitting Bull who resisted arrest. It was one of Sitting Bull's wives who sang
