Dear Mr. Campbell:

Your letter of July 15th, was forwarded to me at Fort Riley. I had the 9th F.A.; the 307th Flash Bn., and Hq 7th ##### F.A. Brig., to manage. I had my hands full which will be understood fully by you, so did not answer, but now have get to it in the pile before me.

When you said that this was the name of Gen. Crock, the name WICHAHNAPI YAMONI was clear to me. It is spelled wrongly, as so often is the case. I served under Gen. Chas. King in Luzon, in 1899.

The name of Gen. Crock was THREE STARS, and is spelled as follows:
WICANHPI YAMONI. The h has a det over it which gives it a sort of k sound - hence the wrong spelling of the word.

I do not believe that Standing Holy has any children living.

I know of none at least. However, I met One Bull, a nephew, the other day.

There is also a nephew named white I wing.

Sorry that you were not at liberty to visit me at Riley. Also gratified to know that the picture sent to you was satisfactory. I took much care in the drawing and coloring, and the event is authentic.
