In reply to your enquiry for material on Sitting Bull, I am sorry we have little or nothing on the subject. All we have is Fletcher Johnston's life of Sitting Bull. I presume you are consulting the Reports of the North West Mounted Police. For those early years they are difficult to get and we have not yet completed our file of them.

Colonel Walker, Calgary, Alta., would doubtless be able to give you ample information. Mrs. J.M. Walsh, 207 King St. East, Brockville, Ont. has some papers of Major Walsh which I have seen and which would be of value to you.

I should judge that Mr. Henderson the artist, Fort Qu'Appelle, Sask. who has painted many of the Sioux and had intimate contact with them might inform you of individual Indians of those times, if they still live.

I am sorry that I have no more direction to give you but wish you every success in your enterprise and shall look forward to your History of Sitting Bull.
