 ?? The print I have, a photographic copy, is marred so that name of interpreter and of No. 6, who looks like a woman, can not be read. Many of these pictures have been reproduced in newspapers and magazines but I have cited reproductions in books and magazines because they are usually clearer and show details of costume etc. better than in newspaper reproduction.
