I think I have some more data in re-Sitting Bull.

Sitting Bull wore a buckskin shirt which was marked "X" on the right shoulder. This shirt was worn by Indians (very few) who were wounded in battle by an enemy and yet would kill the enemy. Sitting Bull was wounded by an enemy (Crow) but fought with the Crow and killed him. (Have you got these facts?)

There was a dark sorrel horse owned by the Hunkpapa Sioux which was named "Sitting Bull" This horse was used by warriors in attacking the strongest positions of the enemy. They thought the horse was sacred. It was wounded nine times, but still survived. Only once during the lifetime of this horse, did the Indians saw Sitting Bull astride of him. This horse was led at the head of their parades. (Have you got these facts?)
