I shall be very glad to see you when you come next summer. I would like very much to talk to you about my own history of the Sioux Indians. My experiences that of Interpreter. Thanks for your kind respects to my family. Father is very feeble now. The Indians with whom you came in contact often speak of you as "The soldier-officer!" Akicita-itancan. Write me at Yates. With best wishes and hoping that I will see you again this summer.
