Yours received. Yesterday I talked with Young Eagle, survivor of Custer's Fight, in re the curly horses. He told me that as far back as they can remember these horses were raised by the Indians. Most of them were of dark color, with hair singed; hence the curly horses. The literal translation is "Horses with burnt hair." (Sung-gu-gu-la) Hoping this information will suffice.
