Dear Mr. Campbell,

About two weeks ago I made a visit to our town library and my wandering gaze was arrested by a new volume labeled "Sitting Bull" - I secured it at once. I knew that you had been at work on it, but did not know that it had been published. I read it with great pleasure. It was like renewing my youth, for when I was a young man I spent a number of years in the western part of the country and saw a lot of the Indians. I lived for over a year on the Ft. Hall reservation among the Blackfoot and Shoshones and most of one summer in northern Idaho where I saw the Nez Percés. Your book seems like the great open spaces and mountain air. I agree with you in your opinion of the way in which the government has treated the Indians.

I have a young friend, Phil by name, who is greatly interested in the Indians and all manner of out door things. He it was that was so interested in your tipi article and letter. He made a fine model, to scale, about twenty inches across
