Dear Mr. Campbell-

Herewith is a letter from Frost, who is a half-blood Indian, and a Baptist minister---and a close friend of mine. It is written in reply to my questions about Sitting-bull--and in your behalf, as promised. Let me say that Frost is very close to both Plenty-coups, and Bell-rock, who are old fighting men of the Crow tribe. I can think of no others who might be likely to remember Sitting-bull. Bell-rock is 87 and the chief himself is about 85, about ten years younger than Sitting-bull would have been if he had lived until now, if I remember rightly. As you know the Crows were continually at war with the Sioux during the lives of the two Crows I have named, and I am surprised that they did not meet Sitting-bull. Old White-man-runs-him and The-crane, two very aged Crows have lately died, so that I'm afraid I can find no others who might help us---however I'll have another try.

If you should drift this way remember that my latch-string is out for you, always.
