Dear Mr. Campbell:

I have your letter of the 10th instant concerning Nez Perce refugees, who fled from the last battle at Bear Paw Mountain to the Sitting Bull band of Sioux Indians. I am pleased to advise that there are several Indian of that party still alive, even though some are getting pretty old, however their association with this band of Sioux is still fresh in their minds occasioned by celebrations in Ghost dancing which was at its height at that time.

The following names have been given me in a hurry and I expect there are others that can be located on this reservation as well as on the Colville reservation.
