To show you the interest I have in this
matter I have to state that I am a part-
Sioux Indian. That I was born in Dakota
Terr. in 1862, that my mother was part Sioux,
that my father was a white man, that
in early childhood I was taken to the
Osage Catholic Mission in Nesho Co. Kansas,
which place is now known as St. Paul,
Kansas. That I was adopted by
Samuel Beveneu an Osage, that
I was afterward adopted by the Osage
tribe of Indians, that I was allotted and
carried on the Osage annuity rolls.
That I came here to the Osage Indians
