It gave me great pleasure indeed to read your fine book about Sitting Bull, the great chief, whom in 1881 I met at Fort Randall, and who became a very good friend of mine. I was glad to find, that you did full justice to the old man, who as well as his entire tribe was maltreated in most reckless manner by the politicians, Indian agents and soldiers of his time.

I am sorry that you did not hear from me before your book was published, as I could have given to you several interesting incidents. As for instance, that when Sitting Bull was killed, my photograph was found on his body, dedicated to him in Nov. 1881, when I left him and the little band of his followers.
