the two reputations lies the truth, and I agree with you that it is probably nearer Sitting Bull's door.

I hope we may keep in touch with each other, because I believe we share alike an admiration for the Sioux people. My interest, of course, is in their life at the present time from the anthropological viewpoint, although I spent three years on the historical sources as well, for a background.

If you happen to know my friend Forrest Clements, at the University, will you please give him my regards?
