I am now trying to learn something about the famous Indians in your country, and this summer I want to get some facts about Sitting Bull. I see in the book by Miss Denmore that there are many songs which Sitting Bull made, and other songs which he sang but did not make. I wish to get the words of these songs he made. Then, when I write my book, I can put those words of his songs into my book.

Will you help me to get these songs? I want the Dakota words
(translation)
written out, and then the English words of the same song. I do not need the music. If you know what the song was used for, or when it was sung, I would like to know that, too. But the words are what I want most of all.

I am willing to pay two dollars for every song you send me, if you are sure it was made by Sitting Bull.
