I regret that my book on Sitting Bull is out of print. I suppose any good bookseller would find one by advertising, though this would add to the cost. Not long ago a rare book dealer in Oklahoma City, James Neill North, 1016 North Central, Oklahoma City 4, Oklahoma, informed me that he knew where he could obtain a copy for about \$10.00. If this copy has not been sold, you might be able to get it through him.

I don't think there is much chance of abolishing the Indian Bureau. It is one of the biggest things in the Department of the Interior, and employs a host of voters. Also, it does perform some service in keeping people from cutting down forests over grazing lands, etc. There have always been abuses in the Bureau, but since most of my work among Indians has been in the field of history, I am not well informed as to present-day Indian problems. I am returning the materials you sent me.
