He was against progress of the white man on the old frontier. He was not a chief, but a Sioux medicine man of some power. He was born in 1834 at Grand River, South Dakota. He was a disturber, always ready to be interviewed. A few newspaper writers made his name famous. The Custer fight was over when he came onto the battlefield. He was shot by Indian Policeman Bullhead, December 15, 1890. His

son Crowfoot was killed with him. His word was good. His father named him Sitting Bull. With all his faults he had some good qualities.
