Dear Sir,

I would respectfully state that the only time that I ever met Sitting Bull, was at Fort Phil Kearny in October, 1867. There was a treaty made with the Sioux, Cheyennes and Arapahoes, at that time which was afterwards ratified early in 1868 at Fort Laramie by the United States Commissioners.

Sitting Bull made an eloquent address at the time in favor of his People. He was a large man of noble and commanding presence. He had great influence with the Sioux, Cheyennes and Arapahoes. He was an influential leader, a medicine man, but not a Warrior.

I have been intimately acquainted with a number of white men and Indians who knew him.
