Sitting Bull was the son of "Sitting Bull", not an uncommon name amongst the plains Indians, also called "Jumping Bull", also "Four Horns, a Sub. Chief, not a full one.

Sitting Bull ^(Jr.) was born about 1837. In his boy-hood he was also called "Jumping Badger".

In his early manhood one authority says of him: he was skillful in the character of a "Peace-maker, but in the early 60's when in his early 20's he became a malcontent and was ~~err~~ afterwards a discontented, disappointed grumbler always a growler, a fullfinder a censurer.

He was a leader of the discontented, not as a warrior but as a "Medicine-Man", and as such had much more influence than the warrior leaders ^{err} did.

He was a splendid specimen of a man being about 6 ft tall, well proportioned, straight, and with a fine shapely head, large nose, and keen brown eyes, the latter rather uncommon
