No. 2 was located at Fort Yates for many years and remembers much about Sitting Bull, Gall and others who were quartered at Stand Rock soon after they surrendered in 1881.

No. 3 was teaching school in the vicinity of Sitting Bull's camp and sent word to Major McLaughlin of Sitting Bull's impending move -- which decided McLaughlin to act. The killing of Sitting Bull followed - in the effort to arrest him.

No. 4 was located at Standing Rock at the time Sitting Bull was killed, and officiated at the funeral services of the Indian police who were killed in the melee.

No. 5 is the leading authority in the United States (I believe) regarding the Cheyennes. He must have mingled somewhat with the Sioux, also. He accompanied the Custer Expedition to the Black Hills (1874) as naturalist.

I hope this brief list may assist you.

Major Carignan is no longer at Standing Rock, or rather Fort Yates; but a letter addressed to him at Fort Yates, with notice to forward will probably reach him.
