- These are the engagements:
- (1) The Battle of Killdeer Mountain, July 26?, 1864. General Alfred H. Sully attacks the Sioux in Dakota Territory.
- (2) Baker's fight. Major E. M. Baker, 2nd Cavalry, repulses hostile Sioux on the Yellowstone, near mouth of Pryor's Creek, August 14, 1872.
- (3) The Hayfield Fight, near Fort C. F. Smith, August 1, 1867.
- (4) The Wagon Box Fight, near Fort Phil Kearny, August 2, 1867.
- (5) Col. J. J. Keynolds attack on the Indian village (called Crazy Horse's village) on Powder River, March 17, 1876.
- (6) The Battle of the Rosebud; General Geo. Crook engages hostile Indians, June 17, 1876, on the Rosebud in Montana.

If you have photographs pertaining to these engagements, I should be happy to obtain them.
