Replying to your letter of July 10th, the Signal Corps files contain many photographs pertaining to Indian campaigns and battlefields, and a few photographs of old maps. As regards those about which you inquire, the following are available:

- 82983. Ruins of old Ft. C. F. Smith, Montana. Evacuated in 1868 - Burned by the Sioux.
- 94316. Wagon Box Fight, Aug. 2, 1867. Sketch showing location of different soldiers and civilians.
- 91058. Ft. Reno, Wyoming, in 1866, on main branch of the Powder River.
- 87770. " " " in 1871.
- 82378. In Camp at Rosebud Agency, S.D. 2 troops of 9th Cavalry; 4 companies of 8th Infantry and 6 companies of 21st Infantry. (Shows general view of agency and surrounding country, and tents of troops.)
- 82390. Sioux Indians at Rosebud Agency, 1889.

We are unable to locate any other photographs pertaining to the engagements mentioned, but are enclosing a list of "Frontier Posts and Early Settlements" in which you may find mentioned other places of interest to you. We should be glad to assist further by giving descriptions of any particular pictures mentioned in the list.
