The Battle of Killdeer Mountain, July 26<sup>th</sup>, 1864. General Alfred H. Sully attacks the Sioux in Dakota Territory.

Baker's Fight. Major E. M. Baker, 2nd Cavalry, repulses hostile Sioux on the Yellowstone, near mouth of Pryor's Creek, August 14, 1872.

The Hayfield Fight, near Fort C. F. Smith, August 1, 1867.

The Wagon Box Fight, near Fort Phil Kearny, August 2, 1867.

Col. J. J. Reynolds attack on the Indian village (called Crazy Horse's village) on Powder river, March 17, 1876.

The Battle of the Rosebud; General Geo. Crook engages hostile Indians, June 17, 1876, on the Rosebud in Montana.
