My dear Professor Campbell:

In sending you that photo  
of Johnny Bingham I just took a chance as to  
whether it might interest you.

If not too late, & you want it for your  
book, I can send you for a short time  
my negative. I got the original from Gen F. D. Baldwin's  
daughter - Mrs A. C. G. Williams - Foster 41011 - Sixth  
St Santa Monica California who also loaned me  
Baldwin's diary from Nov 6<sup>th</sup> to Dec 21 1876  
which clearly shows that the published reports  
that he drove Sitting Bull across the MoR about  
Dec 1<sup>st</sup> is wrong & I so wrote the Adj't Gen of the Army  
recently.

Note by W.C. Brown. War Dept reports say: - "Baldwin \*\*\* overtook Sitting Bull's camp of  
190 lodges (should read 199) followed and drove it south of the Missouri near the mouth of Bark Cr."  
This is thought to be incorrect. Baldwin's diary shows that Sitting Bull was in camp on Porcupine Cr.  
Dec 3<sup>rd</sup> (or earlier) and about Dec 6, evidently hearing of the approach of Baldwin with 3 Cos  
of Infantry, retreated of his own volition southeast across the Missouri, put his women & children  
safely in camp on Bark Cr, and waited in a good position for Baldwin's approach.  
Baldwin found the hostile position almost impregnable, and wisely withdrew until  
he could attack the Indians on equal terms. This opportunity came Dec 18 at the head  
of Redwater Creek.
