Sitting Bull was with the Buffalo Bill Wild West show during the summer of 1885. He had his own small party of about 7 people, all of his own tribe, and was not mixed in with the other Indians. He was you might say a special feater and was treated as such.

So much has been written about the old chief that I do not believe I could add any thing of interest. My remembrance of him is that he was a very kindly, old man, very quiet and reserved, not given to boastfulness, seemed devoted to his family, and seemed interested in all the white man did.

I never knew him to take a drink of intoxicating liquor. His salary was all of \$300. perhaps more for his party. Just what his own salary was I cannot say, for I have not one of our pay rolls with me at this time.
