when the four days of mourning for their losses should elapse. They were pleased with their victory and encouraged by the way they had got into the troops. But they were all anxiously awaiting the fulfillment of the vision Sitting Bull had had at the Sun Dance not long before — a vision of soldiers upside down falling into the Sioux camp — a vision that meant victory among the tipis. The big day was yet to come.
