

Guest was honored with a dance given by Cauchacha-ke and Pigi. The dancers are painted in all colors and any pattern. Faces were masks. Probably about 5000 were present.

Siaux are build like athletes. Many were over 6 feet tall. "The tall warrior" about 7 feet. All take part in dance. old chiefs that can barely walk and children of five years. Sidaus love dances: War, Sun, Dog, Buffalo, Bear, Suroki Women, Bear and Snowshoe dances each having its own characteristic. (Travels into the country of the Siaux' a separate work of Cronan)

On seeing Cauchacha-ke in his wig ~~woman~~ I found him on his couch with a hand mirror to pull the hairs of his beard and mustache and his eye brows, on being told that a portrait of him would be taken, he painted his face with ochre, a warrior brought the head dress of eagle feathers, that reached over the back to the floor. He threw a shawl about his loins and was anxious that all these ornaments should be brought out to advantage.

Ite-o-magayu (Rain in the face) lost his son. This young warrior had died on an infected wound, during the last war he had excelled in bravery. The father sat there motionless wrapped in his blanket, his face painted black. The women gave the warrior his last ornaments. Across
