Thanks very much for your kind letter of February 24, containing the information I asked for. I hope you are getting well rapidly and will soon be home again. I sent you some material written in the Dakota language by One Bull which I hope you will translate for me soon. It was mailed to Reldron. I enclose \$2.00 which is all I have on hand at present. I have been laid up with the flu myself and the doctor collected most of my surplus. I will send some more at the first opportunity.

If you think of anything else please let me hear from you. I would especially like for you to tell me the names of old timers who know about different parts of Sitting Bull's life, particularly his fighting with the white man. You know that he has been reproached by his enemies as being a coward and I want to be sure to convince everybody that this is not true. The best way to do this is to publish the truth about his wars and fights with the white soldiers and other white men, so please send me the names of the men who know more about this. I would also like the names of the Silent Eaters who are still alive, if you can give them to me.
