other's feelings over the wrongs of the red men. I am happy to say that the above suggestion is no longer an experiment, but has been tried thoroughly, with results which are so astonishingly successful that they should be seen to be appreciated. There is a corps of Apache scouts at San Carlos, and they are doing very well, but need experienced men to deal with them. I would not recommend that they be brought under this régime at present. They live in a very difficult country, and are yet wild, having had very little con-/ tact with white people, and having been lately at war with the United States troops. Their present management is the best one for a considerable period in the future."
