LAST HOMAGE TO INDIAN.

Hundreds Mourn Red Tomahawk, Who Slew Sitting Bull.

In the little Catholic church here the body of the aged warrior was viewed after funeral services were read, both in the language of his fathers and in the tongue of the white people whose customs he had adopted. Tonight the body was sent to Bismarck, where burial will take

place Monday.

His death, at the age of 82, removed one of the most colorful figures in the Standing Rock Reservation, where in 1890 he was among the Indian police who sought to arrest Sitting Bull. Red Tomahawk claimed to have fired the shot which killed the noted medicine man.
