My dear professor!

Thank you very much for your very interesting letter of Sept. 5. '16. Also for the Indian postal cards. As to the latter I would say that some of them are of considerable interest and of some value to museums.

Postal cards of permanent value are those showing good reproductions of photos ^{real} or photos of the following subjects: 1. Portraits of old men, ^{& women} who were born ~~under~~ in the old times or spent a part of their lives under the old conditions (full-bloods, of course). ^{Full-blood women in buck-skin costumes! (rare)}

2. Views of tipis, camps etc. showing at least a few of the old features.

3. Photos of travois (with horse)

4. " " baby-carriers with babies (like the one you sent me)

5. " " any full-bloods (all ages & both sexes) showing clearly the features (not necessarily aboriginal costumes), if possible, front and profile view of each head.

All photos should be distinctly marked with the tribe and if possible the native name of subject with English translation.

This kind of pictures is hardly ever found
