I have just concluded the manuscript of a book in which Sitting Bull's nephew, White Bull, narrates the stories of the fights of the Minniconjou and Hunkpape Sioux of which be has first hand knowledge, 1862 to 1876. It will include accounts of the Fatterman fight and the only Indian account extant of the Wagon Box fight. Houghton Mifflin will bring it cut in the spring I believe. Salaries have have been cut to such an extent that I lean more and more on my writing. I should be glad to hear from you again.
