If you are convinced that the face cannot be recognized from the promontory, could you explain the situation in a footnote?

If people read the story in Glacier Park they will surely look for the face & will be puzzled or disappointed if they don't see it.

You don't need to change the text as it now stands, because for the Ind. that patch of snow always represented Snow Spirit even if from certain points of view it did not resemble a human face.

Please make this point clear, as I shall, of course, represent the M^{nt} with the lodge & the Thunder Maker in a full page illustration.

Could it be legitimate to represent in that illustration the face as it appears from the other side of the label, that is to say distinctly as a human face, although it does not really appear that way from the promontory?
