haps look in vain for a resemblance bet. the patch
of snow on the summit of S. to the S. Mt. as seen
from S. to the S. camp, and a human face.

This resemblance is noticed by the white man
only if the ~~mountain~~ ^{peak} is viewed from certain points on
the southern shore of St. M. Lake (see the photos
& half-tone illustrations in the literature on Gl. Pk. that
were taken from the southern shore of the lake).

But for the Indian this gleaming snowfield represen-
ted the face of the Blackfoot culture here no
matter from what point they viewed it.
