Dear Professor:

Enclosed I send you a rather hasty outline sketch of the Tail-piece for Chap. I which will be more appropriate than the galloping buffaloes I first intended using.

It was impossible to represent the camp as Kille saw it from above, overlooking the camping circle. Impossible in a small pen-and-ink drawing. I therefore represent it as K. saw it when he came down the last range of hills and before he crossed the stream which is shown flowing from right to left.

I have tried to get the topography as nearly right according to your text as is possible in a small vignette.

It was impossible to show in so small a space several hundred lodges, they would become microscopic in the reproduction - at least  $\frac{1}{2}$  the size of the enclosed sketch.

The northern portion of the camping-circle is not visible on account of the trees lining the river.

Please state whether this drawing will do. I shall start on another one in the meanwhile.
