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As to your question concerning Sitting Bull, I am at a loss what references to give you. Mooney's Ghost Dance, which you know, is about the only really reliable book I have ever seen. In the nineties of last century I remember having seen a book with many illustrations, mostly portraits of old Sioux warriors, including S. B. and a detailed description of the Sioux "war" of 1890-91. I have, however forgotten the title. I do remember that the book made the impression of having been hastily gotten up by some newspaper man who had reported that "war". -----
 I have just looked up a catalogue of Dauber & Pine Bookshops, Inc. 66 Fifth Ave. Between 12th and 13th Streets, New York City.

This is the war with the Eastern Sioux in Minnesota 1862

In their Catalogue No. 12, 1927 I find on page 13:
 No. 283 Sioux. Heard, Isaac V. D. History of the Sioux War and Massacres of 1862 - 63. With narratives of the various captivities, frontier battles, massacres etc. \$6.

No. 284 Sitting Bull. Johnson, W. F. Life of Sitting Bull and History of the Indian war. Ill. Chicago 1891, \$2.00

This latter book probably is the one I had in mind. If you can't get it from the above source, you might write to other dealers in second hand books, or go to a large book store and let them advertise for a copy in certain publications.

Other possible sources of information: B. A. Eth. Handbook of Am. Ind., Publications of the Historical Societies of North or South Dakota or Nebraska or the history departments of the respective state universities. These are all the sources or possible sources I can think of. Possibly the Bureau of Ethnology in Washington could make further suggestions.
