As to your question concerning Sitting Bull, I am at a loss what references to give you. Mooney's Ghost Dance, which you know, is about the only really reliable book I have ever seen. In the nineties of last century I remember having seen a book with many ibhustrations, mostly portraits of old Sioux warriors, including S. B. and a detailed description of the Sioux "war" of 1890-91. I have, however forgotten the title. I do remember that the book made the impression of having been hastily gotten up by some newspaper man who had reported that "war".

I have just looked up a catalogue of Dauber & Pine Bookshops, Inc. 66 Fifth Ave. Between 12th and 13th Streets, New York City.

In their Catalogue No. 12, 1927 I find on page 13:
