in reading a book on Sitting Bull besides myself and pos-
sibly Professor Broderius, a philologist at the University
of Louisville (I dont know the address of his residence).
He is, however, so onesided in his philological interests
that I doubt whether he would be interested in any other
approach to the subject.

An exhibit of specimens from my collection in the
showcase of a local bookstore (W. K. Stewart) is hardly
feasible because they wont guarantee the safety of the spe-
cimens which are, at least to me, of some value.

All I could do would be to recommend the purchase
of the book to the local library, although that institu-
tion had to cut its budget and even salaries considerably
during the last year.
