Dear Mr. Weygold:

I have your letter of March 1, informing me that Mr. Hots has prepared a German edition of the *FAMILY HUNTING GAZETTE*, that he can get in all 12½ % from the German publisher. I think this will be satisfactory to me, if the percentage can be fairly divided among the four of us (Lyons & Carnahan, Mr. Hots, yourself, and me).

As for myself, I am content to receive the same royalty for the translation into German as from the American edition. With this understanding, I authorize you to make any arrangements with Mr. Carnahan and Mr. Hots which you see fit. I understand that accounts are to be settled yearly, direct from Germany to each of us personally. Since Mr. Carnahan is not furnishing plates, that seems fair. I am enclosing a signed copy of this letter, which I wish you to forward to Lyons & Carnahan.

Please keep me informed what you decide upon, when you and Mr. Carnahan and Mr. Hots have come to an agreement.
