I believe the secretary of the Regina Board of Trade has already informed you that I am planning to visit your province this summer in the hope of finding something in the historical archives having to do with Sitting Bull. I am hoping you have a complete set of the annual reports of the Royal Northwest Mounted Police from their organization to 1881. Anything else in your archives which may throw light upon Sitting Bull's relations with your government or with other tribes will be very welcome to me. As I expect to be rather pressed for time when in Regina I am going to ask you if possible to make plans for my arrival soon after the middle of June. It will help me greatly if I can at once lay my hands on the materials you have.
