

Dear Dr. Campbell:

In reply to your note of November first, I wonder whether you have consulted Mooney's publication on the Ghost Dance. It is possible that he has some relevant material for your purposes. Of the living informants among the Crow I am hardly in a position to speak as I have not been to the reservation for some years and the old men are dying off rapidly. However, I suggest you make enquiries of Plenty-Coups and Medicine Crow. The former used to live in Pryor, Montana, the other at Lodge Grass. White-Man-Runs-Him used to have the reputation of being the only Crow survivor of the Custer fight. It is possible that he may have something of value for you. My impression is that he lives at Crow Agency now. His stepson or son-in-law, I forget which, Robert Yellowtail, was recently living in Wyola.
