

Mr. W. W. W. had pushed fur trade (any Detons?)
(Mo. Fur Co) : Kisa very patriotic, made
agreement for all Mo. Riv. tribes along mouth of
Kansas River - 1814 - by Gov. Clark -

He kept his own tribes well satisfied & kept
Eastern ~~tribes~~ in awe of them - & scare stories -
& let Creeks & Yaubens attack downas (Brit,
allies), these Mess. tribes sat close at home, while
Mo. tribes hunted & lived in plenty - showed them how
to garden & eat vegetables (pumpkins, beans, corn, spuds)
(turnips), gave them knives, hatchets etc made in
his blacksmith shops - made his forts asylums for
old & decrepit - Had a post at Council Bluffs
& another (probably) upon American Island at

Chamberlain. Had horses, cattle, hogs, poultry,

→ all Dak. loved him above all whites of his time -

Loisel post burned in 1810

1814 : Mo. Riv. Dabotus in fine shape, while the
Miss. Dab. were poor, without trade, worried, gloomy
deserted by allies & suspicious of Americans
