Their horses were mostly beautiful, spirited beasts; some were masked in a very singular manner, to imitate the head of a buffalo deer, (red) or cabbrie, with horns, the mouth and nostrils- even the eyes- trimmed with a red cloth. This ornamentation gave them a very fierce appearance. They were by far the best built and most active horses I had ever seen***superior*** in every respect, to those we see to the northward.
