He says, "We were in this savage condition, when we finally became a larger people, and as we increased our number it was very hard to get food for so many, and there was one particular time of year when we almost starved to death, and we would meet where there was good water and camp there and pretty near starve to death. We were in this condition, when something happened that changed our whole way of doing. We were camped near a large spring that ran out of a rock, and the next day the young men were sitting on the ground around this spring, gambling." Now this is the way they gamble; This is the first gambling game the Indians ever had. This little basket marked with little places on them. Well now they were playing this game and you can imagine how any little thing would attract them, and finally a young man came up and was dressed different than the Indians had ever seen, and pretty soon another young man came up and stood by his side and he says "What are you mocking me for?" Well he says, "There was a person in the spring told me to dress this way, and I must do as he says." Well then the other one says, "A person in the spring told me to dress this way too." Then the first one says, "Well come on, let us go and test it and see if it is true or not." Then they went to the spring and then they dove down and came to another country, and they went into a house and there saw a young woman and the Great Spirit told them he was going to take pity on them and give them something to eat; and she showed them how to plant corn, and how to work for themselves so they could always have enough to eat and would not have to go hungry any more. Now she says, "You must go up there and teach your people how to plant their corn; so she gave them seven loaves of the bread she was baking on the stone, and so they went up there and told the others that the Great Spirit had taught them how to teach them; and then they called up the Chiefs and the old men and fed them and when they fed all of them there was just as much as there was before, and then they called up the orphans and every-
