

the old fort and here is located a military cemetery where the famed Indian Chief Washakie and a number of other American soldiers are buried. The chief governed Sacajawea's people for nearly 60 years and was considered the foremost Indian of the trans-Mississippi West. Fort Washakie is located on the highway leading to the south entrance of Yellowstone Park and is visited annually by thousands of tourists. Thus at Fort Washakie there is much of historical significance. Sacajawea is part of that significance. A memorial to her rightly and fittingly belongs there.
